<u>COUNSE DESCRIPTION</u>: Ceramics I is a <u>studio class</u>. Students will work with the Elements of Art while exploring various hand building techniques and the pottery wheel. We will be doing several projects throughout the semester, as well as daily assignments that will foster creativity and expand innovative thinking.

<u>GRADING</u>: Student grades will be determined by mastery of content. The final grade will be a combination of the following two grades:

1. <u>Assessments</u> (summative assessments and major projects) = 80%

2. <u>Classwork</u> (worksheets, sketches, participation) = 20%

<u>GRADING SCALE</u>: All grading is based on rubrics with clear objectives. The grading scale is as follows:

0 Incomplete Missing work, insufficient effort or participation.

1 Remediation Aware of expectations but is unable to meet mastery.

2 Near Mastery Student can meet mastery level with assistance.

3 Mastery Student has mastered the material.

4 Assignments (Advanced Mastery): This is a simple "homework" assignment where students will explore the current unit by critiquing another artist's work. The **4 Assignments** are <u>optional</u>, however they heavily affect your student's overall grade.

LATE WORK: If work/projects are not completed on the <u>due date</u>, students have <u>one week</u> to make up the missing assignment. It is your student's responsibility to make up missed assignments.
